The Equestrian Centre offers a rare combination – a school livery yard in the heart of a thriving co-ed day and boarding school. For students who already ride, or who want to learn, Sidcot is a popular choice, as we pride ourselves on our friendly atmosphere for both beginners and experienced riders alike.

Sidcot Equestrian Team

Keen riders, who own their own horse, will be encouraged to join the Sidcot Equestrian Team. This gives students the opportunity to take part in lessons and clinics and team training in a wide range of disciplines.

There are regular opportunities to compete both locally and at national events and we are very proud of the continued success of the Sidcot Team.

Sidcot Equestrian is affiliated to both the National Schools Equestrian Association (NSEA) and British Showjumping Just for Schools (BS JFS) where we have been incredibly competitive at both regional and national level. Sidcot has team representation at each level and height across all disciplines, including Dressage, Showjumping, Arena Eventing and Jumping with Style.

Sidcot's Riding Programme

For students interested in riding who do not own a horse, we offer a full riding programme with lessons on our School horses.

We have a choice of horses at our Equestrian Centre, to suit a range of abilities and experience.

So whether you simply want to try horse riding for a bit of fun, or aim to take riding more seriously, we can support your ambitions.







Our Sidcot Riding Programme teaches the fundamentals of riding, with clear progression and opportunities to experience riding before investing in the cost of owning a horse and full livery.

Assessment

The Sidcot Riding Programme is a continual assessment programme that allows students to build on a range of riding skills and progress through bronze, silver, gold and platinum levels. Students will not only gain confidence in controlling a horse, but they will also develop equine and stable management knowledge.

Start date

The programmes start every half term, with sessions once a week for the duration of the half term. Each lesson will have a maximum of four riders per instructor and are charged at £37.50 per session. Depending on the number of weeks in the half term, students would need to commit to the full half term lessons.

Students will receive a certificate and badge at the end of each level. Places are limited and are offered on a first come first served basis.

Urchinwood Manor*

Our Bronze course will take place in our partner riding school, Urchinwood, on a Monday and Tuesday after School.

Urchinwood Manor, which is 10 mins away from Sidcot, provides a range of facilities including an indoor and outdoor arena, cross country course consisting of jumps from 1'0" to 3'3" and show jumping courses. Transport will be arranged by the Equestrian Centre.

Sixth Form

Students in the Sixth Form will also have the opportunity to have lessons during study periods, however we cannot guarantee these will be group lessons. 1-1 lessons are charged at £57.50 per session.

Unsure which level to start at?

If you are unsure of your most suitable entry level progression point, please contact Zoe, our Equestrian Manager. Zoe is very happy to review videos and assess the correct level for you.

Opportunities for further progression

Once students have graduated from Platinum, we may be able to provide higher level 1-1 lessons on one of our School horses or assist students with securing a loan horse or purchasing a horse to continue their riding journey.

Sidcot services

Full livery offer

We offer a full livery package at £185 per week. A £2,000 deposit is required. This package includes:

- Bedding
- Adlib haylage
- Stable and field usage (depending on individual requirements)
- Basic feed (feed supplements not included)
- All year round turnout

In addition to providing a comfortable and clean stable, we will speak with you to ensure (within reason) your horse's needs are catered for to avoid boredom and the development of bad habits or stress related behaviours. This will be achieved by providing a good yard routine, adequate care, exercise, plenty of variety and human contact.

On a routine basis, our professional staff will provide:

- Mucking out
- Grooming
- Tack cleaning
- Supervised free riding sessions
- Exercise in horse walker

Staff can provide extra services at an additional cost.



The advantages of keeping your horse here at the Sidcot Equestrian Centre are numerous. They include:

- Full access to our facilities which include a 30 x 40m floodlit arena
- Full set of British Showjumping jumps
- Horse walker
- Solarium
- Hot shower
- Off road hacking



Riding lessons - Students with their own horses

In addition to our livery offer we are able to provide 1:1 or group riding lessons by our highly qualified riding instructors from beginners to advanced riders. These lessons provide a great opportunity for students to advance their current skills or explore new ones and will be tailored towards the student and their horse. Regardless of which option you choose, our floodlit arena will provide an excellent facility for both rider and horse.

These lessons are arranged with our Equestrian Centre Manager at the start of term. The cost is £25 for a one-hour group lesson and from £50 for a one-hour individual lesson.

Keen riders will be encouraged to join the Sidcot Equestrian riding team, which gives them the opportunity to take part in lessons/clinics and team training in a wide range of disciplines.

There are regular opportunities to compete both locally and at national events and we are very proud of the School's ongoing success. Sidcot's School team was the winner of the 2022 National Showjumping Championships.
